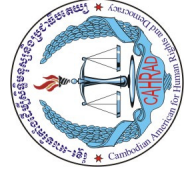

1991 Paris Peace Agreement at a Glance

On October 23 1991, the Agreements on a Comprehensive Political Settlement of the Cambodia Conflict were signed by Cambodia and 18 other nations in the presence of the United Nations Secretary-General. The agreements were the culmination of more than a decade of negotiations in which the Secretary-General had been closely involved from the outset.

They comprise of:

1. FINAL ACT OF THE PARIS CONFERENCE ON CAMBODIA
2. AGREEMENT ON A COMPREHENSIVE POLITICAL SETTLEMENT OF THE CAMBODIA CONFLICT
Annex 1. UNTAC mandate
Annex 2. Withdrawal, cease-fire and related measures
Annex 3. Elections
Annex 4. Repatriation of Cambodia refugees and Displaced persons
Annex 5. Principle for a new constitution for Cambodia
3. AGREEMENT CONCERNING THE SOVEREIGNTY, INDEPENDENCE, TERRITORIAL INTEGRITY AND INVIOABILITY, NEUTRALITY AND NATIONAL UNITY OF CAMBODIA
4. DECLARATION ON THE REHABILITATION AND RECONSTRUCTION OF CAMBODIA

Some points to emphasize in regard to Sovereignty and Human Rights:

In regard to the Sovereignty, Article 1, Agreement # 3, states that "Cambodia solemnly undertakes to maintain, preserve and defend sovereignty, independence, territorial integrity and inviolability, neutrality, and national unity; the perpetual neutrality of Cambodia shall be proclaimed and enshrined in the Cambodian constitution..." and in Article 2 "To this end, Cambodia undertakes: ...d) To terminates treaties and agreements which are incompatible with its sovereignty, independence, territorial integrity and inviolability, neutrality and national unity:..."

For Human Rights, it is said in Article 3.1 that "All persons in Cambodia shall enjoy the rights and freedoms embodied in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and other relevant international human rights instruments." And in Article 3 it states that "The United Nations Commission on Human Rights should continue to monitor closely the human rights situation in Cambodia, including, if necessary, by the appointment of a Special Rapporteur who would report his findings annually to the Commission and to the General Assembly."
